ORDINANCES

House Numbers

In compliance with Village ordinances and as a courtesy to the DPW staff, law enforcement officers and fire and rescue crews, all houses and businesses must have address numbers attached to them so they are visible from the street. Numbers must be a minimum of four inches in height and placed six feet above ground level. Even if your house number is on your mailbox, mailboxes are often located on the opposite side of the street, so address numbers must also be attached to your house or business.

Summer 2016 Village Property Taxes will be mailed July 1 and are due by 5 pm on Wednesday, September 14. Taxes received after September 14 will be charged penalties and interest. Postmarks are not accepted

Grass

Village Ordinance 24-6 (Abatement of weeds, litter, and unsafe trees) states:

The owner or person in control of any private premises shall at all times maintain the premises free of litter; provided, however, that this section shall not prohibit the storage of litter in authorized private receptacles for collection. The owners or persons in control of any private premises shall at all times maintain the premises free of noxious weeds and grasses, and unsafe trees or limbs. All owners are required to cut weeds and grasses on vacant lots or other premises prior to such weeds and grasses going to seed. The village will mow at a charge as currently established or as hereafter adopted by resolution of the village council from time to time if mowing is not done 48 hours after posted notification.

Large Trash Pick Up

Each household is allowed two free large item pick-ups per year. **RESIDENTS MUST CALL THE VILLAGE HALL (429-1802) TO SCHEDULE A PICK-UP.** Large pick ups will be scheduled for Mondays and Thursdays.

Prohibited items include construction debris, electronics, tires, hazardous waste, appliances containing Freon, yard waste and items too heavy for an employee to pick up. Place items behind the curb (never in the street or on a sidewalk) during the weekend for Monday pick-up. Republic Services does offer a yard waste container, if you are interested. Yard waste service is at the resident's expense.



Brush Removal

DPW employees will pick up small quantities of branches, brush and **bagged** leaves on Mondays. Leaves will only be picked up through the spring. Leaf pick up with the leaf vacuum will resume in the fall.

Limit branches and brush to less than half a pickup load, 4" in diameter and cut to six feet in length. Larger quantities are charged as a large item pick-up. You will be charged for exceeding these guidelines.

Items must be left at curbside, not out in the road. Leaves must be bagged.

No more than 10 bags per week.

Any items that are not allowed to be picked up will be left and will be the resident's responsibility to dispose of.

DPW does not pick up trees or limbs that a tree service has removed for you.

Yards and Sidewalks

Help us keep streets free of leaves, grass clippings and branches. Edging sidewalks and curbs in front of your home and use of weed killer where appropriate improves curb appeal.

Please trim and rake items away from fire hydrants, trees, poles or other obstacles. Shrubs, flowers and trees should not extend over sidewalks and overhanging trees should be trimmed to seven feet.

If you notice sidewalk tripping hazards, such as more than 1/2" difference between slabs or loose pieces of concrete, please let the Village know so those sections are included in the repair schedule.
